- A shop for mum : La compagnie de Provence
- A shop for dad : La distillerie Janot
- And the kids? Les minots de Marseille
- Feel peckish? les navettes des Accoules

Step 2: Le Fort Saint Jean

• Unmissable : l'Espérantine and the Mucem garden

Step 3: Le Vieux-Port

- A coffee and a cookie : Emilie and the Cool Kids, rue Vacon
- Unusual desire : Maison Empereur, an extraordinary store to visit!
 Meeting point at rue d'Aubagne

Step 4: L'Opéra

- Le pain de l'opéra : one of the best boulangeries in Marseille
- Nearby: Burger's banquet for a kid's burger, and Le Petit souk for beautiful kid's gifts.

Step 5: Notre-Dame-de-la-Garde - Vauban

- A reward after all that effort ?
 EMKIPOP, in Vauban, come and enjoy original ice creams
- And if that's not enough : the famous pizzeria La Bonne Mère!











Tour 2 : A new era

Discover the perfect mix between modernity and old.

Walking time: 1 hr 15 Minimum

Difficulty:

Step 1: The Mucem

 An architectural must-see, designed by Rudy Ricciotti. Currently, you can see an exhibition about Greek-Roman and Cretan mythology, for a little bit of history.

(preferential rate for families)

Step 2 : Next to the MuCEM : la Villa Méditerranée

 Currently closed because of installation of a reproduction of the Cosquer cave.
 Opening is scheduled for June 2022.
 For now, you can observe its amazing architecture...

Step 3 : La Major

 A magnificent Byzantin-style cathedral built between 1852 to 1893.
 Have you seen its matchstick mock-up?

Step 4: Les Docks

 This site was used to store goods from the port, but it is now a must-visit shopping location, with its architecture inspired directly by English docks. You will find many restaurants!

Step 5: Le Silo

• An old industrial building in the city which has been transformed into a performance hall. This building catches the eye with its unique architecture.









Tour 3: Looking for greatness

Escape with a walk.

Walking time: 1 hr 15 Minimum

Difficulty:

Step 1 : Saint-Vincent-de-Paul Church (Les Réformés)


• This neo-gothic style church was built between 1855 and 1886. Admire its 2 spires, 70m high. It is as high as Notre-Dame de Paris!

Step 2: Palais Longchamps

 The Palais Longchamps is a monument built to receive the waters of the Durance in 1862. Its majestic foutain is a must-see! Its houses a park, an observatory still in operation, the Natural History Museum and the Museum of Fine Arts in its wings.







• Tour 4 : Sea air

What better way to recharge your batteries than a day by the sea?

Walking time: 1 hr 45 Minimum

Difficulty:

Step 1: Le Pharo

A beautiful park with a splendid view of the Vieux-Port entrance and the sea! The Chalet will welcome you for a refreshment or a meal.

Step 2: La plage des Catalans

This is one of the few sandy beaches in the city, and the closest to the Vieux-Port.

Step 3: Vallon des Auffes

Viaggi di Fonfon, Chez Jeannot and l'Epuisette, all you need to delight your taste buds, and as a bonus, the superb boutique Pois Chic to browse items made in Marseille.

Step 4: Malmousque

In the heart of this little fishing village, venture along the alleys leading down to the sea.

Step 5 : Plage du Prado

A paradise for windsurfers and surfers can be found at Epluchures Beach. Right next to it you can make a Ferris wheel ride at Escale Borely, with a breathtaking view of the harbor!


Mx Experience - 4D experience in the Docks Village
